THIS MONTH IN U.S. HISTORY

November 11, 1918

At 5 a.m., in Marshall Foch's railway car in the Forest of Compiègne, the Armistice between the Allied and Central Powers was signed, silencing the guns of World War I effective at 11 a.m.--the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. In many places in Europe a moment of silence in memory of the millions of fallen soldiers is still observed. In the U.S., Veteran's Day is celebrated with parades and military memorial services.

November 22, 1963

At 12:30 p.m., on Elm Street in Dallas, President John F. Kennedy was shot while in a motorcade. He was proclaimed dead at 1 p.m. after being rushed to Parkland Memorial Hospital. On board Air Force One, at 2:38 p.m., Lyndon B. Johnson was sworn in as the 36th President.

November 26, 1789

The first American holiday occurred, proclaimed by President George Washington to be Thanksgiving Day, a day of prayer and public thanksgiving in gratitude for the successful establishment of the new American republic.

November 29, 1864

U.S. Army troops led by Colonel Chivington attacked and killed at least 400 Cheyenne and Arapahoe Indians at Sand Creek, Colorado after they had already surrendered.
