NOVEMBER IN MISSISSIPPI HISTORY

November 6, 1848

The University of Mississippi opened its first semester of classes, with the class consisting of 79 Mississippians and one Tennessean. The first university president was George Frederick Holmes, a 28-year-old who would remain in office for only five months.

November 8, 1950

William Faulkner was notified that he had won the Nobel Prize for literature.

November 17, 1916

Novelist and historian Shelby Foote was born in Greenville, Mississippi.

November 28, 1729

Indians of the Natchez tribe attacked French settlers at Fort Rosalie, burning the fort and killing 138 men, 35 women, and 56 children. The Natchez revolt would spread through the area, with a massacre at Fort St. Pierre, overlooking the Yazoo River near present-day Redwood. The French eventually sent 1,400 men from New Orleans to drive them out of the Grand Village near Fort Rosalie; over the next two years they would lay siege to the Natchez, virtually destroying them as a nation.
